

RULES OF

Persatuan Penyelidikan Pergigian Antarabangsa Kawasan Asia Tenggara, Bahagian Malaysia

(Malaysian Section of the Southeast Asian Division of the International Association for Dental Research)

1. Name and Place of Business

- (1) The Society shall be known as the Persatuan Penyelidikan Pergigian Antarabangsa Kawasan Asia Tenggara, Bahagian Malaysia (Malaysian Section of the Southeast Asian Division of the International Association for Dental Research) hereinafter called the Section.
- (2) Its registered place of business shall be : c/o Department of Conservative Dentistry, Faculty of Dentistry, University of Malaya, 50603 Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

or at such other place or places as may from time to time be decided on by the Council. The registered place of business shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Registrar of Societies.

(3) Structure

A. ASSOCIATION: The International Association for Dental Research is a non-profit corporation organized under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, United States of America. It has been established to promote research in all aspects of oral and related sciences, to encourage development of improved methods for prevention and treatment of oral and dental diseases, and to facilitate co-operation among investigators and communication of research findings and their implications throughout the world. Any individual, without any considerations of colour, caste, race, religion, age, gender, national or ethnic origin, or disability, who is interested in Dental Science and Dental Research shall be eligible for membership in this Association, as set forth in the Bylaws, provided such person conforms to the recognized standards of professional ethics. Its registered office is at 1619 Duke street, Alexandria, VA 22314-3406, USA.

B. DIVISION: This Division is an organization of thirty or more members of the Association in Southeast Asia formed with the approval of the Council of the Association, for the advancement of the objectives of the Association. Its official address shall change every two years with the change of Office Bearers.

C. SECTION: This Section is an organization of ten or more members of the Association in Malaysia formed with the approval of the Division as provided for in the Division's Bylaws. The affairs of the Malaysian Section shall be managed in harmony with the Constitution and Bylaws of the Association and of the Division.

2. Aims and Objectives

- (1) The Association has been established to promote broadly the advancement of research in all branches of dental science, and in those phases of the related sciences which contribute directly to the development of oral health.
- (2) To encourage and facilitate co-operative effort and achievement by, and mutual helpfulness among, investigators in all nations in every division of stomatology to the end that dentistry may render cumulatively a more perfect service to humanity.

These objectives of the Association will be promoted by this Section through its operations in Malaysia. All operations of the Section will be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Section's registered rules.

3. Logo

The Section's logo consists of a triangle in white enclosing a flame in orange and yellow. On both sides of the triangle are laurel leaves outlined in gold on a white background. An oval with longitude and latitude lines in white and gold defining blue sections form the background of the logo. The name of the Section in capital Bahasa Malaysia in black letters surround the globe.

4. Membership

- (1) (a) Membership shall be open to:
 - (i) Any individual who is a Malaysian citizen or a non-Malaysian citizen residing in Malaysia but not with permanent resident status and is interested in Dental Science and Dental Research, shall be eligible for membership in this Section, without any restrictions of colour, race, religion, age, gender, national or ethnic origin, or disability, as provided for in the Bylaws of the Section, provided such person conforms to the recognized standards of professional ethics.
 - (ii) Any individual who is a member of the International Association for Dental Research who is a Malaysian or non-Malaysian residing in Malaysia but not with permanent resident status shall be eligible for membership in this Section.

(b) Types of membership

i) Ordinary Members

- a. Persons who are conducting or have conducted research in any branch of dental science or in fields related to dental science;
- b. Persons who have either presented scientific papers based upon original research before national or international meetings, or published in scientific journals one or more papers based upon original research in any branch of dental science or in fields related to dental science.

The prerequisites for Ordinary Membership in the Section are persons who are (i) members of the International Association for Dental Research and (ii) Malaysians or non-Malaysians but not of permanent resident status.

ii) Associate Members

Persons of scientific training or attainment who are interested in the furtherance of dental research but who do not fulfill the eligibility requirements for Ordinary Membership.

iii) Student Members

Persons enrolled as undergraduate or postgraduate students in Malaysian universities who have interests in dental-related research and recommended for Student Membership by the Head of Department and with the written approval of the Vice-Chancellor of the University concerned. Persons admitted to Student Membership can apply to become Ordinary or Associate Members when eligible.

iv) Research Technician/Assistant Members

Persons who are full-time research technicians or assistants and interested in the advancement of dental research in Malaysia, and recommended for Research Technician/Assistant Membership by the Dean/Head of Department.

v) Life Members

Persons who have attained the age of 60 years and have been members of the Section in good standing for at least 10 years. In the event of ill health or retirement, only the latter qualification will be necessary for Life Membership.

vi) Honorary Members

Honorary Membership of the Section may be granted each year to persons by affirmative vote of the majority of the members of the Section present and voting at an Annual General Meeting. Honorary members shall be selected on the basis of their significant contributions to dental research and/or development of the Section.

(2) Application for membership shall be on the prescribed application form of the Section and submitted to the Council for approval.

(3) Any individual who is eligible for membership under 4(1)a and 4(1)b, who has submitted information required in the prescribed application form and whose membership credentials have been found acceptable by the Council, shall become a member upon payment of dues.

(4) Subscriptions and Other Dues

The Annual membership fee payable shall be as follows:

i) Ordinary Member	RM50.00 (fifty ringgit)
ii) Associate Member	RM50.00 (fifty ringgit)
iii) Research technician/Assistant Member	RM20.00 (twenty ringgit)
iv) Student Member	RM20.00 (twenty ringgit)
v) Life Member	Exempted from paying dues
vi) Honorary Member	Exempted from paying dues

All dues shall be payable to the Treasurer on or before January 1st of each year.

(5) Membership period shall be effective after receiving acceptance notification by the Council.

(6) Obligations of Membership

(a) All members shall abide by the Rules and not act in any way inconsistent with its objectives.

(b) All members must notify the Secretary in writing of any change in postal and e-mail addresses, telephone and/or fax numbers.

(7) Discontinuance:

Termination of membership shall be according to the Bylaws of the Section.

(8) Rejection

The Council reserves the right to reject any application for membership and is not obliged to enter into correspondence nor to give reason/s to the applicant for such a decision.

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5. Privileges of Membership

(1) Ordinary Members

- i) Have the right to actively participate in all General Meetings of the Section.
- ii) Have the right to participate in all other functions and meetings of the Section.
- iii) Have the right to stand for election and hold office in the Section.
- iv) Have the right to nominate or second a candidate for election to posts of the Section.
- v) Have the right to vote and be voted in a General Meeting of the Section.
- vi) Shall receive all publications, notices and correspondences sent to members by the Sections.

(2) Associate Members

- i) Have the right to actively participate in all General Meetings of the Section.
- ii) Have the right to participate in all other functions and meetings of the Section.
- iii) Shall receive all publications, notices and correspondences sent to members by Section.
- iv) Have such privileges that the Council may from time to time decide.

(3) Student Members

- i) Have all the privileges of Ordinary Members or Associate Members except without the right to hold office or vote.
- ii) Have such privileges that the Council may from time to time decide.

(4) Research Technician/Assistant Members

- i) Have all the privileges of Ordinary Members or Associate Members except without the right to hold office or vote.
- ii) Have such privileges that the Council may from time to time decide.

(5) Life Members

- i) Have all the privileges of Ordinary Members or Associate Members.
- ii) Are exempted from paying dues to the Section.
- iii) Have such privileges that the Council may from time to time decide.

(6) Honorary Members

- i) Have all the privileges of Associate Members.
- ii) Honorary Members who were formerly Ordinary Members shall maintain the privileges of Ordinary Membership, except the right to stand for election or hold office.
- iii) Are exempted from paying dues to the Section.

6. Election and installation of officers

- (1) The President and President-Elect shall be nominated from among the Ordinary Members of the Section and shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Section by a majority vote of those present and voting.
- (2) The terms of office of the President and the President-Elect shall be for two years or until a duly elected successor takes office.
- (3) In the case of death, disability or absence of the President, the President-Elect shall assume the duties of President for the remainder of the term or the duration of the disability or absence. In the case of death, disability or absence of both the President and the President-Elect, the Immediate Past President shall assume the duties of President for the remainder of the term or the duration of the disability or absence.
- (4) A Secretary and a Treasurer shall be nominated from among the Ordinary Members of the Section and shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting by the majority vote of those present and voting and the term of office will be two years renewable. They can be elected to office for not more than two terms consecutively.
- (5) The President and President-Elect shall also serve during their incumbency as Representatives of the Section to the Council of the Division. Should the President and/or the President-Elect be unable to attend the meetings of the Council of the Division, alternate representative/s shall be elected by the Council of the Section.
- (6) Elected Officers shall assume their offices immediately following the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting at which they are elected.

- (7) The President, President-Elect and Secretary shall constitute the Executive of the Section.

7. Function of the Council

- (1) The function of the Council is to organize and supervise the day-to-day activities of the Section and to make decisions on matters affecting its running within the general policy laid down by the General Meeting.
 - (2) The Council may not act contrary to the expressed wishes of the general meeting without the prior reference to it and shall always remain subordinate to the General Meeting.
 - (3) It shall furnish a report to each Annual General Meeting on its activities during the previous year.
 - (4) The Council shall meet at least once every three months, and 10 days notice of each meeting shall be given to the members. The President acting alone, or not less than three of its members acting together may call for a meeting of the Council to be held at any time. At least one half of the Council Members must be present for its proceedings to be valid and to constitute a quorum.
 - (5) Additional or special meetings of the Council may be convened by the Executives, i.e. the President, the President-Elect and the Secretary. Additional or special meetings of the Section may be convened by the Council.
 - (6) Where any urgent matter requiring the approval of the Council arises and it is not possible to convene a meeting, the Secretary may obtain such approval by means of a circular letter. The following conditions must be fulfilled before a decision of the Council is deemed to have been obtained.
 - (a) The issue must be clearly set out in the circular and forwarded to all members of the Council;
 - (b) At least one-half of the members of the /council must indicate whether they are in favour or against the proposal; and
 - (c) The decision must be by a majority vote.
- Any decision obtained by circular letter shall be reported by the Secretary to the next Council meeting and recorded in the minutes thereof.
- (7) Any member of the Council who fails to attend three consecutive meetings of the Council without satisfactory explanation shall be deemed to have resigned from the Council.

- (8) In the event of the death or resignation of a member of the Council, the Council shall have the power to co-opt any other Ordinary Member of the Section to fill the vacancy until the next Annual General Meeting.
- (9) The Council shall give instructions to the Secretary and other officers for the conduct of the affairs of the Section. It may appoint such officers and such staff as it deems necessary. It may suspend or dismiss any officers or member of the staff for neglect of duty, dishonesty, incompetence, refusal to carry out the decisions of the Council, or for any other reason which it deems good and sufficient in the interest of the Section.

8. Cessation of Membership and Resignation

(1) Automatic cessation

Membership will be automatically terminated when a member ceases to fulfill the provisions for eligibility as specified in Paragraph 491) of the Section's registered rules.

(2) Resignation

Any member desiring to resign his/her membership to the Section, shall notify the Secretary in writing with advance notice prior to the date of the next dues. Such a member shall be required to pay any arrears on subscription or other monies owed by him/her to the Section.

(3) By default*

Any member who has failed for one year to pay his annual dues to the Section, and whose reason for the non-payment has not been accepted by the Council, shall, at the end of the year of non-payment, automatically forfeit membership in the Section and shall be notified by the Secretary of the said termination.

(4) Reinstatement of Membership

Any member who has his/her membership terminated by the Council for any of the above stated reasons, may apply for re-instatement by sending to the Council a duly completed application form prescribed for such purpose. Any member who is not satisfied with the decision of the Council in this matter, may appeal to a General Meeting of the Section, whose decision shall be final provided at least two-thirds of the members present with voting rights have voted in favour of such a resolution.

9. General Meeting

- (1) The members of the Section shall meet annually in general session and have powers and duties as provided in the Bylaws.
- (2) A regular meeting of the Section for scientific and business purpose shall be held once each year at a place and time determined by the Council or a majority vote of the members present and voting at a preceding Annual General Meeting.
- (3) Sites for an annual general meeting, if selected two years in advance, must be ratified at the Annual General Meeting immediately preceding.
- (4) (a) Abstracts of papers to be presented in the Scientific Programme at the Annual General Meeting must be in the hands of the Section's Secretary by a date to be notified.
(b) The Executive, in office at the time of the Scientific Meeting, is empowered to determine which abstracts shall be accepted for presentation and shall record in the records of those proceedings the reasons why any abstracts may not have been accepted for publication and the author or authors concerned be informed.
- (5) The President, or in his absence the President-Elect, shall act as Chairman of the Scientific Programme and shall designate other persons to act as Chairman of particular sessions within the programme.
- (6) The President, or in his absence the President-Elect, shall preside at the Annual General Meeting.
- (7) Quorum: At any Annual General Meeting of the Section or any Extraordinary General Meeting of the Section called by the Section Council, half of the total voting members or twice the number of Council members, whichever is lesser, shall constitute a Quorum.
 - (a) As the legislative body of the Section, the Council shall consider all proposals concerning changes in the Rules and Bylaws and make recommendations to the Section.
 - (b) The Council shall receive reports from Section Officers, Corresponding Members and Committees and shall act upon the recommendations and resolutions contained in these reports.
- (8) If half an hour after the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting shall be postponed to a date (not exceeding 30days) to be decided by the Council; and if a quorum is not present half an hour after the time appointed for the postponed meeting, the members present shall have power to proceed with the business of the day but they shall not have power to alter the rules of the Section.

- (9) An Annual General Meeting of the Section shall be held as soon as possible after the close of each financial year not later than April on a date and at a time and place to be decided by the Council. The business of the Annual General Meeting shall be:
- (a) To receive the Council's report on the working of the Section during the previous year;
 - (b) To receive the Treasurer's report and the audited accounts of the Section for the previous year;
 - (c) To elect a Council and to appoint an auditor once every two years for the ensuing two years.
 - (d) To deal with such other matters as may be put before it.
- (10) The Secretary shall send to all members at least 15 days before the meeting an agenda including copies of minutes and reports, together with the audited accounts of the Section for the previous year. Copies of these documents will also be made available at the registered place of business of the Section for the perusal of members.
- (11) An Extraordinary General Meeting of the Section shall be convened:-
- (a) Whenever the Council deems it desirable; or
 - (b) At the joint request in writing of not less than twenty voting members, stating the objects and reasons for such meeting.
- (12) An Extraordinary General Meeting requisitioned by members shall be convened for a date within thirty days of the receipt of such requisition.
- (13) Notice and agenda for an Extraordinary General Meeting shall be forwarded by the Secretary to all members at least 10 days before the date fixed for the meeting.
- (14) Paragraphs 9(7) and 9(8) of this rules regarding the quorum and postponement of an Annual General Meeting shall apply also to an Extraordinary General Meeting, but with the provision that if no quorum is present after half an hour from the time appointed for a postponed Extraordinary General Meeting requisitioned by the members, the meeting shall be cancelled, and no Extraordinary General Meeting shall be requisitioned for the same purpose until the lapse of at least six months from the date thereof.

- (15) The Secretary shall forward to all members a copy of the draft minutes of each Annual and Extraordinary General Meeting as soon as possible after its conclusion.

10. Council

- (1) A Council consisting of the following, termed the Office-Bearers of the Section, shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting:*
- i) A President
 - ii) A President-Elect
 - iii) The Immediate Past President
 - iv) A Secretary
 - v) A Treasurer
 - vi) 2 Ordinary Council Members
 - vii) State representatives. In addition, the President shall appoint a Corresponding Member from each state in Malaysia where there is in existence interests to promote the activities of the Section, to be a member of the Council.
- (2) All Council Members and every officer performing executive functions in the Section shall be Malaysian citizens. Non-citizens shall require the prior approval of the Registrar of Societies.
- (3) The affairs of this Section shall be administered by a Council which shall exercise the functions set forth for it in the Rules and the Bylaws of the Section, the functions assigned to it by vote of the Section, and such other functions as may be necessary in the conduct of the business of the Section.
- (4) The nomination, election, selection, appointment, terms of office succession and powers and duties of the elected officers shall be as provided in the Bylaws of this Section.
- (5) Duties:
- (a) The duties of the officers shall be those ordinarily associated with the official titles and such other duties as the Section and the Council may assign.
 - (b) Each elected officer shall report annually to the Council and the Annual General Meeting of the Section on the conduct of his office.

11. Duties of Office-Bearers

- (1) The President shall during his term of office preside at all general meetings and all meetings of the Council and shall be responsible for the proper conduct of all such meetings. He shall have the casting vote and shall sign the minutes of each meeting at the time they are approved. He shall, in conjunction with the Treasurer, sign all cheques on behalf of the Section.
- (2) The President-Elect shall carry out such duties as directed by the President or the Council. In the event that the President is unable to complete his term of office in case of death, disability or resignation, the President-Elect shall assume the duties of the President.
- (3) The Immediate Past President shall deputise for the President on request of the President or the Council.
- (4) The Secretary shall conduct the business of the Section in accordance with the Rules, and shall carry out the instructions of the General Meeting and of the Council. He shall be responsible for conducting all correspondence and keeping all books, documents and paper except the accounts and financial records. He shall attend all meetings, and record all proceedings. He shall maintain an up-to-date membership register consisting of details such as name, identity card number, date and place of birth, occupation, name and address of employer and residential address.
- (5) The Treasurer shall be responsible for the finances of the Society. He shall keep accounts of all its financial transactions and shall be responsible for their correctness. He shall, in conjunction with the President sign all cheques on behalf of the Section.
- (6) The Ordinary Council Members and State Representatives shall carry out such duties as directed by the President or the Council.

12. Financial Provisions

- (1) Financial year:
The financial year shall be from 1st January.
- (2) Dues:
At each Annual General Meeting of the Section the amount of the annual dues to the Section shall be determined by the Council and announced and shall be approved by a two thirds majority vote of those present and voting at the Annual General Meeting and be effective from the date of approval of the Registrar of

Societies. In case no Annual General Meeting is held, this function shall be exercised by the Council of the Section.

(3) Expenditure:

The Council of the Section may authorize expenditure of funds of the Section to defray expenses for the business of the Section.

(4) Reports:

All officers collecting, disbursing, or holding in trust assets belonging to the Section shall report annually to the Council and the Section in written form.

(5) Subject to the following provisions in this Rules, the funds of the Section may be expended for any purpose necessary for the carrying out of its objects, including the expenses of its administration, the payment of salaries, allowances and expenses of its office-bearers and paid staff, and the audit of its accounts, but they shall on no account be used to pay the fine of any member who may be convicted in a court of law.

(6) The Treasurer may hold a petty case advance not exceeding RM500 (five hundred ringgit) at any one time. All money in excess of this sum shall within seven days of receipt be deposited in a bank approved by the Council. The bank account shall be in the name of the Division.

(7) Authorized banks and expenditure.

Funds of the Section shall be deposited in a bank or banks approved for the purpose by the Council of the Section. Authorized expenditure from the general funds of the Section shall be made by cheques, each of which must be signed by the Treasurer and one other Elected Officer of the Section.

(8) All cheques or withdrawal notices on the Section's account shall be signed jointly by the President (or in his absence the President-Elect), and the Treasurer. In the absence of the Treasurer the Council shall appoint one of its members to sign in his place.

(9) No expenditure exceeding RM10,000 (ten thousand ringgit) at any one time shall be incurred without the prior sanction of the Council, and no expenditure exceeding RM100,000 (one hundred thousand ringgit) in any one month shall be incurred without the prior sanction of a general meeting. Expenditure less than RM10,000 (ten thousand ringgit) may be incurred by the President together with the Treasurer.

(10) As soon as possible after the end of each financial year i.e. 31st December, statement of receipts and payments and a balance sheet for the year shall be

prepared and audited by the Auditor appointed under the Rule 13. The audited accounts shall be submitted for the approval of the next Annual General Meeting, and copies shall be made available at the registered place of business of the Section for the perusal of members.

13. Audit

- (1) One person, who shall not be an office-bearer of the Section, shall be appointed, by the Annual General Meeting as an Honorary Auditor. He shall hold office for two years only and shall not be re-appointed.
- (2) The Auditor shall be required to audit the accounts of the Section for the two years, and to prepare a report or certificate for the Annual General Meeting. He may also be required by the President to audit the accounts of the Section for any period within his tenure of office at any date, and to make a report to the Council.

14. Journal

The official publication of the Association, the “Journal of Dental Research”, shall be the official publication of the Section.

15. Bylaws

- (1) Bylaws and amendments to Bylaws may be proposed at any Annual General Meeting of the Section and may be adopted at the same meeting by affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members present and voting, the Bylaws and/or amendments taking effect at the close of the meeting at which they are adopted.
- (2) Interpretation
 - a) Between annual general meetings the Council shall interpret the rules of the Section, and when necessary, determine any point on which the rules are silent.
 - b) Except where they are contrary to or inconsistent with the policy previously laid down by the general meeting the decisions of the Council shall be binding on all members of the Section unless and until countermanded by a resolution of a General Meeting.
 - c) In the interpretation of the Constitution and Bylaws, the decision of the Council shall be final unless countermanded by members at a General Meeting.

(3) Definitions

- a) Members of this Section, for the purpose of notice or other communications or actions, are those persons who are members according to the latest information possessed by the Secretary at the time of mailing of the notice or communication or the time of the action.
- b) Notice shall be considered to have been given to a member when written notice has been sent by e-mail or surface mail to the member at the latest address for the member known to the Secretary at the time of mailing.
- c) The Section shall be registered as a non-profit organization in Malaysia.

16. Committees

Appointment to standing and Ad Hoc Committees shall be made usually by the President. The Council may designate membership for the Committees created by them for special functions.

17. Prohibitions

- (1) Neither the Section nor its members shall attempt to restrict or in any other manner interfere with, the trade or prices on engage in any Trade Union activities as defined in the Trade Union Ordinance, 1959.
- (2) The Section shall not hold any lottery whether confined to its members or not, in the name of the Section or its Council or members.

18. Amendments of Rules

- (1) These Rules may not be altered or amended except by resolution of a General Meeting. Such alteration or amendments shall take effect from the date of their approval by the Registrar of Societies. Any amendment to the rules shall be forwarded to the Registrar of Societies within 60 days of being passed by the general meeting.
- (2) Proposal
A proposal amendment to the Rules, formally endorsed by at least voting members and accompanied by a statement of reasons for adoption, may be presented at any General Meeting of the Section, and thereupon becomes a special order of business for vote by members at the succeeding General Meeting.

(3) Voting procedure

When an amendment to the rules has been properly proposed, the Secretary shall mail the following information to each member of the Section not less than one month before the next General Meeting of the Section:

- a) A copy of the amendment,
- b) The names of the sponsors and the stated reasons for its adoption,
- c) A copy of this Paragraph 18 of the Section's registered rules and
- d) A ballot for a vote on the amendment.

19. Dissolution

- (1) The Section may be voluntarily dissolved by a resolution of not less than three-fifths of the total voting membership.
- (2) In the event of the Section being dissolved as provided above, all debts and liabilities legally incurred on its behalf shall be fully discharged, and the remaining funds shall be disposed of in such manner as may be decided upon by a General Meeting.
- (3) Notice of dissolution shall be forwarded to the Registrar of Societies within 14 days of its dissolution.

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- (vii) State representatives. In addition, the President shall appoint a Corresponding Member from each state in Malaysia where there is in existence interests to promote the activities of the Section, to be a member of the Council.**
